TUCC NATIONAL CONFERENCE BEGINS

The 9th National Conference of Trade Union Coordination Centre (TUCC), the trade union wing of All India Forward Bloc and a central trade union recognized by Ministry of Labour of Employment, government of India began today at Hudson Memorial Church Community Centre, Mission Road, Bangalore. TUCC is a Trade Union Organization under the influence of the political philosophy of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose.

Shri P.T. Parameshwar Naik, Labour Minister of Government of Karnataka inaugurated the Conference. While addressing the gathering, Shri Naik opined that he is a strong believer of tripartite mechanism, which can resolve many problems through negotiations. He further opined that the state of Karnataka is making labour laws in favour of the working people without destroying the atmosphere of investment atmosphere in the state.

Shri. Debabrata Biswas, general Secretary of All India Forward Bloc was the chief guest. While addressing the delegates, he urged upon the working people that all the trade unions should unite against the anti-labour policies of the government. Now the government is making all major labour laws in favour of the capitalist. The TUCC should play an important role in building such unity.

Shri Dorai Swamy, veteran freedom fighter hoisted the flag and addressed the gathering. In his address, he opined that the working class is the vanguard of India's production system, which must be protected. The working people should agitate whenever their rights have been snatched by the government and managements.

Mahinda Jayasinghe, leader of All Ceylon Trade Union Federations, Sri Lanka also addressed the gathering. Messages from different Trade Unions from Bangladesh, Pakistan, Nepal, Cyprus, Khasakistan, AIBEA, Defence Employees Federations also read out in the conference.

Com. G.R. Shivashankar, President of TUCC presided over the inaugural Session. Com. G. Devarajan, Secretary TUCC welcomed the delegates and placed the draft resolutions.

475 delegates from 20 states are participating in the Conference. The conference will conclude on 28th Feb. A rally will of workers will be held on 28th Feb. from Mysore Bank Circle at 11 AM and will hold the Public meeting at Town hall.

The Conference is discussing the future course of action and demands that the minimum wages should be fixed as minimum wages, contract labour should get equal wages of the permanent workers, stop disinvestment of PSUs etc. The Conference will elect new central Committee of TUCC.
